What a year (okay, eighteen months) of celebrations it has been! As we culminate the series of events marking Up with People's (UWP) first half century, it is worth highlighting a few of the major events.

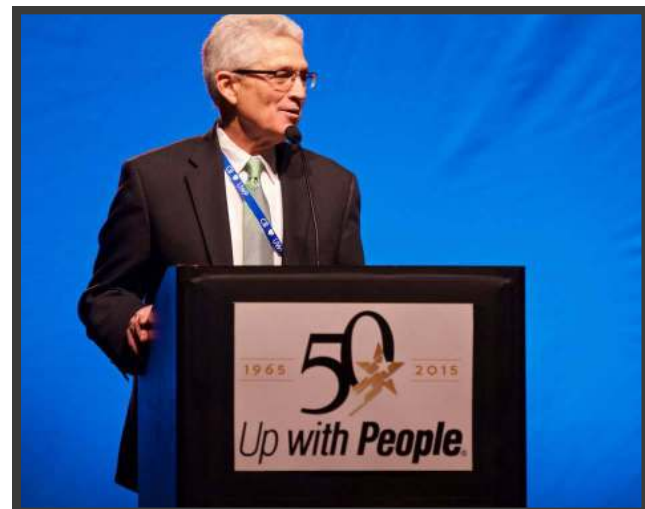
**THE JOURNEY** | The 50th Anniversary show was launched in January 2015. Written not only to honor the past fifty years but to also be relevant to contemporary times, the show has continued to evolve as global events have occurred and has been well received in the United States, Mexico, Bermuda, and throughout Europe.

**THE 90/50 EVENT** | In March 2015, UWP luminaries from around the world gathered in Tucson to celebrate our founder, J. Blanton Belk's, 90th birthday and his life's work of building and sustaining UWP. What a party it was!

**CELEBRATE 50** | It is hard to find anyone who was not overwhelmed by the spirit, pride, and emotion of the great reunion in Orlando last August. More than 3,000 UWP alumni, family, and friends gathered to mark this milestone exactly fifty years to the day of our first public show in 1965.

**CELEBRATE 50—MEXICO** | An extraordinary week of programs in Mexico City culminated with more than 1,500 UWP supporters attending the Saturday performance featuring an appearance by the Colwell Brothers—UWP's musical founders—on stage with Cast 2016 A. What an emotional moment it was as we reflected on the unique role they played in UWP's history.

**CELEBRATE 50—EUROPE** | The final 50th Anniversary event took place in Brussels, the home of UWP in Europe. Although events in Paris and Brussels forced the postponement of the event—and it sometimes seemed that it might never happen—it was appropriate that we culminated our celebrations there. *Continued on next page.*
